# CAMP 2010

TO: Pastor and/or Youth Leader  
RE: Youth Camp 2010

Greetings in the name that is above every name; the Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that as you receive this letter you and your church are enjoying the blessings of the Lord and are seeing His mighty hand at work in and through your church.

The purpose of this letter is to furnish you with information regarding Summer Youth Camp. The dates for our camp this year are **July 12th - 16th** and it will be held once again at **Bethel Youth Camp**. There will be a combination of group activities along with team competition. This is designed to cultivate unity within each particular church as well as to form and build friendships with youth from other churches.

This year's theme is **THIRST**. The theme will encourage our youth to have a thirst for God, His Word, and His will for their lives.

There will be great preaching throughout the week as we will have multiple speakers in the evening services. As in the past, we will have morning classes designed for specific age groups to challenge and encourage our youth to live their lives for the Lord Jesus Christ as well as to clearly present the gospel to those who are lost.

The age requirement for camp is **9 years through 12th grade**. This year's camp fee is **\$118.00 per camper**. Bethel Youth Camp has raised our fee a few times in the past few years. We have raised our fee at a considerably lower rate in order to cover our church's expenses. Last year FRMBC's camp fund ended up in the red. We strive to set our camp fee so that we can have just enough money to cover camp expenses. Such expenses include the camp fee; food for breakfast, lunch, and dinner; an honorarium for the camp speaker; and needed supplies for camp. Our camp fee remains much lower than what nearly every other similar camp charges.



We ask that camp counselors are sent from each church that attends camp and suggest one adult camp counselor from your church for every 10 campers from your church. It has worked out well with our church in the past years for the church to pay the camp fee for our counselors. Camp counselors will definitely have a great time at camp, however, they are attending camp to minister to the children. Having their fee paid for them is a great incentive. Not all churches may be able to pay for all their counselors; it is only a suggestion that has proven to be a success. We also have campers that are sponsored by folks in our church. Either someone can sponsor one child or give money to go toward half of a camp fee. Every little amount helps defer the cost for the families of children going to camp. We have found that our elderly folks are eager to help a child go to church camp. Then our kids send them thank you cards after camp. It really helps bridge the generation gap in our church. Just some things to consider.

**IMPORTANT:** This year we are asking for participating churches to have your camp fees and registration forms turned in to FRMBC by Saturday, June 26th. Having to deal with papers and checks has proven to hinder the initial set-up time on the first day of camp. We understand that there may be additions or subtractions of campers during the final two weeks before camp and those can be dealt with on the first day of camp. Anyhow, it would help out on our end if we could have everything in our hands by Sunday, June 27th. Just let us know as soon as anyone is added.

**Special Note:** We are asking churches to impress upon those interested in going to camp to decide to attend by Sunday, June 13th. We understand that not everybody will know by then, but if we could get a good estimate that would be helpful. Churches then can give us that number, via phone call or e-mail, on that next Monday, June 14th. This is simply to give us adequate time to make a close estimate on how much food to purchase. We have done this in the past and it helped so that we did not purchase too much food. Thank you for your help with this.

Enclosed in this packet are copies of the flyer, registration and health form, and the information brochure. There is important information in the brochure every camper must know regarding camp rules and regulations. There will be a campers meeting on the first day of camp to go over some of the details. Feel free to make as many copies of this information as you need.
